Course Title

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY (Survey Techniques)

I. Brief Description

This is an introductory course to basic methodological concepts. By the end of this course, students should be able to organize and conduct effective research work.

II. Course Objectives

2.1.- General Objective

To enable students to master the set of rules or stages related to the production of effective intellectual work.

2.2.- Specific Objectives

- a) Grasp the theoretical and practical concepts required for conducting research effectively.
- b) Master the different stages related to the organization and planning of intellectual work.
- c) Acquire the tools and methods necessary to better organize and carry out effective intellectual work.

III. Teaching Method

The instructor will use a lecture-based method followed by debates, discussions, and critiques. Due to the extensive scope of this course, some topics will be covered through student-led presentations in class, followed by debates and discussions starting from December.

A working session schedule will be followed during the current academic year. In each session, the group will give a concise one-hour presentation, accompanied by a written document summarizing the content of the oral presentation. The presentation will be graded at the end of each session (20% of the final grade).

The group must submit a typed copy of their research work, ranging from 3 to 5 pages, on the day of the written exam scheduled by the Dean's Office.
